- When a student fails to secure a pass in a theory course / laboratory course (except electives), the student shall register and appear only for the end semester examination in the subsequent semester.
- In such case, the internal assessment marks obtained by the student in the first appearance shall be retained and considered valid for two subsequent attempts.
- However, from the third attempt onwards if a student fails to obtain pass marks (IA + End Semester Examination), then the student shall be declared to have passed the examination if he/she secures a minimum of 50% marks prescribed for the End semester examinations alone.

Award of Letter Grades (Students admitted during the Academic Year 2021-2022 onwards):

- The award of letter grades will be decided based on relative grading principle.
- The relative grading is applicable to ONLY those students who have passed the examination as per the passing requirements enumerated above.
- For those students who have not passed the examination, Reappearance (RA) shall be awarded as shown in the below Table.

- The students should NOT have been prevented from writing end semester examination due to lack of attendance in any semester.

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
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














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
