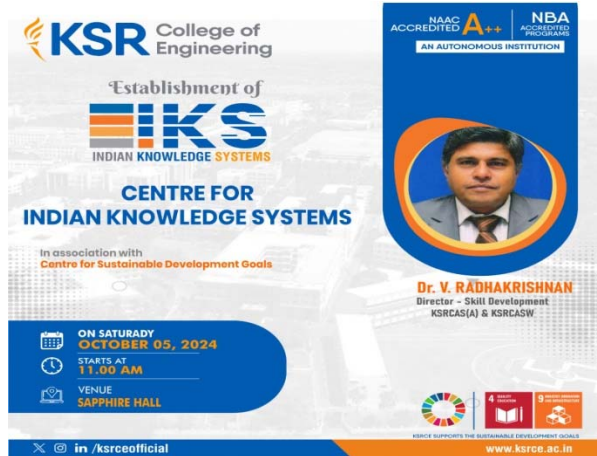

1. Establishment of Centre for IKS

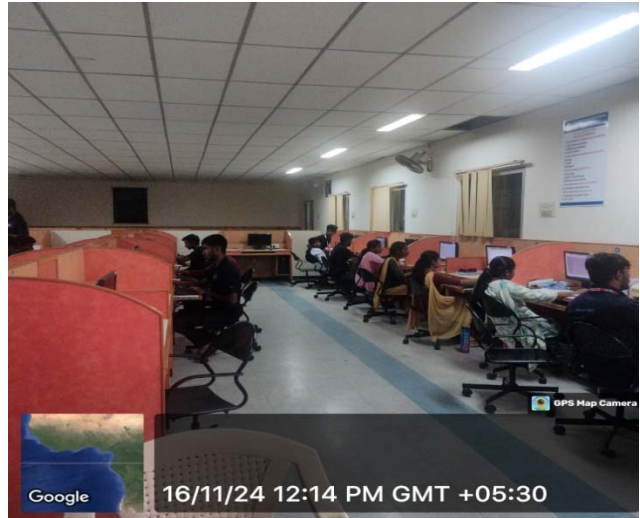
8. Drawing Competition: Depicting Indian Festivals
